I note with pride and am pleased to commend you for your performance of duty at United States Coast Guard Station Fort Pierce, from December 2001 to June 2002 while recalled to active duty as a result of the tragic events of September 11, 2001. Displaying exceptional aptitude and professionalism, you quickly qualified as a boat crewman and boarding team member. During this time you responded to more than 50 search and rescue missions accounting for numerous lives saved. Most notable was the May 2000 rescue of four persons from a vessel taking on water off Fort Pierce inlet, in which you assisted in quickly locating the survivors and safely returning them to shore without injury. Demonstrating the highest degree of proficiency, you took on the weight room renovation project, and were instrumental in locating and obtaining various donated exercise machines and other physical training equipment. Your tireless efforts resulted in saving the Coast Guard over \$3000 in equipment and parts for this project.
